### Ponderings of the Preacher . . .

Can you believe that this year is almost half over? It has surely been an unusual one and one that we all hope will not ever happen again. These are interesting times in which we live.

Is anyone in charge of this mess? Psalms 31:14-15a says, "But I trust in you, O Lord; I say, 'You are my God.' My times are in your hands;". What an encouraging passage of Scripture! Despite the uncertainty of the times we can always rest secure in God's care. Our times whether they are bad, good, certain or uncertain are in His hands.

Psalms 11:3-4 says, "When the foundations are being destroyed, what can the righteous do? The Lord is in his holy temple; the Lord is on his heavenly throne." We can certainly identify with the first part of this passage. It seems like many of the things that we once thought were secure and reliable (the foundations) are crumbling. How should we respond? We can respond with confidence knowing that our God is still in charge and on His heavenly throne.

I think it is right to refresh your memory as long as I live in the tent of this body" (2 Peter 1:12-13). These two apostles knew there were certain ideas that Christians needed to be reminded of often. They were not embarrassed to be repetitive in their teaching.

Let's remain faithful always trusting in God's care. Let's stay the course always being faithful in serving our Lord.

# Book Of The Months June & July

#### Study Guide for 1 & 2 Kings and 2 Chronicles

The books of the Kings were not originally separated. This division first occurred in the Septuagint (the Greek translation of the Old Testament). These two books give us the history of the two kingdoms of Israel along with their respective kings beginning with Solomon. The purpose of the author was to show how the rise, decline and the fall of the two kingdoms were the results of the holiness and faithfulness or the unfaithfulness and idolatry of the different kings and their subjects. The two books cover a time period of 4 ½ centuries (beginning of Solomon's reign to the fall of Jerusalem). Some have suggested that the books were written by Jeremiah but the authorship is uncertain. Second Chronicles is a parallel narrative of just the history of the Kingdom of Judah. Many of the details of the histories are the same but there are some details found in Chronicles that are not found in the Kings.




