"58 killed, 515 hurt in Las Vegas Strip massacre."

It seems like that we have been inundated with bad news in the last few weeks. Death and destruction has been the theme of the news we read, hear and see from the newspapers, radio, TV, and internet.

We desperately need to hear some good news and our friends and neighbors also desperately need to hear some good news. Do we have any good news to share? The answer is "Yes, we still have good news."

Despite the tragedies that surround us, let us understand that God has not deserted us. He has promised us, "Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you." (Hebrews 13:5) Although we may think God has deserted us, may we cling to this promise knowing that our God is still with us and always will be.

Although it may seem like things are out of control, God is still in control.
