#### Ponderings of the Preacher . . .

Last week we celebrated Flag Day and in two weeks we will be celebrating Independence Day. I just read an article written by Harvey Mackay, a businessman and motivational speaker, that I thought would be appropriate to share in this column.

#### RED, WHITE, AND TRUE BLUE

June 14 is Flag Day, celebrating the 13 strips and the 50 stars that symbolize our humble beginnings and our growth into one unified nation.

On June 14, 1777, in Philadelphia, the Marine Committee of the Second Continental Congress adopted a resolution that stated, "Resolved, that the flag of the United States be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white, that the union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field representing a new constellation.

But the resolution never said a word about the significance behind the choice of red, white and blue – because the three colors did not have any official meaning when the flag was adopted in 1777. But have you ever stopped to think about the meaning of the flag's colors? There's plenty of symbolism there too. Red implies hardiness and valor. (My thought: Red could also remind us of the price that was paid for our freedom – the blood of thousands of brave men and women who laid their lives down in defense of our country.) White stands for purity and innocence. Blue signifies vigilance, perseverance and justice. These qualities that our country was founded on should carry through in our lives and businesses today.

According to an article on Time.com, Mike Buss, a flag expert with the American Legion, says that the most obvious reason for the flag's colors is that they were simply taken from our mother country's flag - the Union Jack of England. "Our heritage does come from Great Britain, and that was some of the thought process that went about in coming up with our flag." Buss says of the American flag's red, white and blue. "They come from the three colors that the Founding Fathers had served under or had been exposed to." Although most Americans today aren't aware of the specific symbolism behind the flag's red, white and blue, flag expert Buss is not concerned. Instead, he believes the flag's power to evoke patriotism and pride after all these years is most important.

My thoughts: May our flag continue to wave over this great land! May we humble ourselves before our God realizing He is the source of our nation's strength! Please God, continue to bless America!


